At the age of fifteen, I smoked my first joint. I was intrigued by the way pot made me feel. As time went by, I kept a bag of dope on me wherever I went. First thing in the morning, I needed that rush to start the day. Throughout the day, I took hits to keep me “buzzed.” This continued for fourteen years. I told people that I could quit whenever I wanted to, I just didn’t want to stop. When my baggie of drugs was low I became nervous and anxious. All I could think about was a way to get high. I couldn’t relax until my drugs were replenished. If drugs like coke, hash, and mescaline were available, I could not resist them. I was in bondage.

**Is your life a mess too? Do you have problems in your life
that are stopping you from going forward?
Have you ever asked,
“Is there a way to overcome my habits?”**

There was once a man who had come to a minister to inquire if there was any way that he could overcome his habits and addictions. When he was a young boy he had made a profession of faith in Christ but later had gotten in with the wrong crowd and could not break free from his addictions.

The minister told him that he had come to understand only half of the gospel, the gospel of forgiveness that results in wiping out the penalty of our sins. But Christ is also a living Savior that can save from the power of sin. When temptation comes, the minister encouraged him to go to Christ for the power to resist his sin. Sometime later the minister received a letter stating that he had found constant victory by going to and trusting the living Savior to deliver him from the power of his sins.

Friend, I have been free from drugs for the past seventeen years, all because there is a living Savior that we can go to for the power to deliver us from sin.

5. Read Galatians 5:16. "This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh." If we walk in the Spirit, that is, trust Him moment-by-moment for our deliverance from the law of sin, what will be the result?

6. Read Galatians 5:19-21. "Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, [20] Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, [21] Envious, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God." If we do not depend upon the power of God's Spirit to deliver us, what kind of things will manifest in our lives?

7. Read Romans 8:2. "For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death." What deliverance is available from sin and its death?

11. Read 2 Corinthians 10:4. "For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds." When we continually give place to the flesh, we can develop what? _____.

12. Read Ephesians 6:12. "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." And Acts 10:38. "How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him."
