# STUDYING THE BOOK OF HEBREWS IN SMALL GROUP DISCUSSIONS

## **Lesson 4 - Jesus Greater Than Moses - Hebrews 3:1-6**

Read the following verses in the New International Version or a translation of your choice. Then discuss the questions that follow. Questions should be studied by each individual before your discussion group meets.

HEB 3:1 Therefore, holy brothers, who share in the heavenly calling, fix your thoughts on Jesus, the apostle and high priest whom we confess. [2] He was faithful to the one who appointed him, just as Moses was faithful in all God's house. [3] Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself. [4] For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. [5] Moses was faithful as a servant in all God's house, testifying to what would be said in the future. [6] But Christ is faithful as a son over God's house. And we are his house, if we hold on to our courage and the hope of which we boast.

# **Lesson 5 - Warning Against Unbelief - Hebrews 3:7-19**

HEB 3:7 So, as the Holy Spirit says:

"Today, if you hear his voice,

HEB 3:8 do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion, during the time of testing in the desert,

HEB 3:9 where your fathers tested and tried me and for forty years saw what I did.

HEB 3:10 That is why I was angry with that generation, and I said, `Their hearts are always going astray, and they have not known my ways.'

HEB 3:11 So I declared on oath in my anger, `They shall never enter my rest.' "

HEB 3:12 See to it, brothers, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. [13] But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called Today, so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. [14] We have come to share in Christ if we hold firmly till the end the confidence we had at first. [15] As has just been said:

"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion."

HEB 3:16 Who were they who heard and rebelled? Were they not all those Moses led out of Egypt? [17] And with whom was he angry for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the desert? [18] And to whom did God swear that they would never enter his rest if not to those who disobeyed? [19] So we see that they were not able to enter, because of their unbelief.

- 58. In light of the disobedience of the Israelites of the Exodus, what command was given to the Jewish Christians of the first century? (3:12)
- 59. How are those described who turn away from the living God? (3:12)
- 60. What is the connection between sin and unbelief? (3:12-13)
- 61. How might a person show that he or she has "come to share in Christ"? (3:14)
- 62. How long did the disobedient Israelites wander in the wilderness? (3:17)
- 63. What happened to the generation of Israelites who rebelled against God in the wilderness? (3:17-18)
- 64. What can we do to avoid hardening our hearts toward God?
