

5 MINUTE LESSONS ON THE KINGDOM OF GOD

I Give Unto Them Eternal Life; And They Shall Never Perish (John 10:28)

Why do the Apostles spend so much time warning Christians (that shall never perish), of the dangers of sin, the hardening of their hearts, and departing from the Living God? (Hebrews 3:12-14; 2:3; 3:6; 10:26; 12:25; James 5:19-20; 2 Peter 2:20; 1:10-11; 3:17).

Didn't Jesus say,

"All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." (John 6:37)

"And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing..." (John 6:39)

Yet a large portion of Scripture gives warnings to Christians.

When a seed is planted, it soon begins to grow and we can see the signs of life that have been started. Jesus tells us in Luke 8:13, there are some who begin the journey of faith and later fall away. It may have seemed like they had life, but it never bore fruit.

"They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away." (Luke 8:13)

The seed of the word sprang up and began to grow, which looks like a Christian with signs of life, but the life only endured for a while. There are many verses that state a true Christian continues in the faith (Colossians 1:23; 1 Corinthians 15:2).

The reason the Apostles warn Christians about this is because the people they address claim to be Christians, but evidently they do not express the life of Christ or His teachings.

"If any man teach otherwise, and consent not to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which is according to godliness; ⁴*He is proud, knowing nothing..."* (1 Timothy 6:3)

These people that claim to be Christians, but don't follow Him (Mark 8:34; John 10:27-28) are in your church. How do I know that? Because they were also in the early church

(Acts 20:29-30; 2 John 1:9; Galatians 2:4; Jude 1:3-4; 3 John 1:9-11). These people are religious. They may have cast out demons, prophesied, saw miracles, said, "Lord, Lord" and used the Christian terms and names. They may have eaten with you in your fellowship meals, but they have forsaken the right way and have gone astray (2 Peter 2:15; Matthew 7:20-23; 2 Peter 2:13). They followed the err of sin and iniquity (Matthew 7:23), but you could not argue with them that they are not Christians.

It's amazing to me that sometimes the Scriptures describe a believer only by the works and deeds they have done or by what they do (see Matthew 25:31-46; Romans 2:5-11; Matthew 7:21; 1 John 3:3; 1 John 3:7-8). These Christians show an active life of ongoing repentance and faith!

^{*«*16}You can identify them by their fruit, that is, by the way they act. Can you pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? ¹⁷A good tree produces good fruit, and a bad tree produces bad fruit. ¹⁸A good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. ¹⁹So every tree that does not produce good fruit is chopped down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰Yes, just as you can identify a tree by its fruit, so you can identify people by their actions." (Matthew 7:16-20 New Living Translation)
