Dear C.,

Romans 3:23 says we all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. This is in the present tense and means that we sin and we continue to fall short of His perfect standard. 1 John 1:8-9 says,

"8 If we say that we have no sin we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9 KJV)

The point is that in our fallen humanity, we come short of His perfection. Because of this, we need a Savior to rescue us and deliver us from the penalty of sin. This is referred to as being saved by God's grace. No matter how we strive to continue in holiness, we need Jesus' blood to cleanse us from all sin in our imperfect state. Yes, my heart can be turned towards God, yet I fail to meet His perfect standard of perfection. That's why the sacrifice of Jesus was needed and the blood of Jesus Christ will always be needed to meet God's standard perfectly.
